

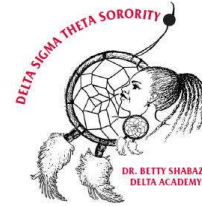

Organizational Background

Founded in 1913, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is a private, non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world. The major programs of the sorority are based upon the organization's Five Point Thrust: Economic Development, Educational Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental Health, Political Awareness and Involvement. A sisterhood of more than 200,000 predominately Black college educated women, the sorority has over 900 chapters in communities around the world, including Compton. The Compton Alumnae Chapter has been a force in the Compton community since 1989. The chapter reflects women who live or were raised in the city of Compton and who seek to bring their career, community, leadership and life expertise towards supporting and enhancing the Compton community
